PHOTOCOPIES FOR RESEARCH

The Bertrand Russell Archives have on file almost all the articles written by Lord Russell and most of the reprints of these articles, whether in periodicals, books, or pamphlets. We are trying now to obtain all books and articles about Russell. The Archives also contain a large number of unpublished writings by Russell which are of considerable importance, as well as private correspondence with friends, relatives, and important people in many fields of human endeavour. This very good and substantial collection of writings by and about Russell may be used by anyone interested in studying Russell's life and thought.

Photocopies may in principle be had of these published and unpublished writings, although the copyright laws impose certain restrictions and McMaster's contract with Russell's estate certain others. Clearance may be obtained by writing to the Archivist who will supply the necessary information. The charge for photocopies is \$.10 each plus postage. All copying will be done on Xerox machines except for print-outs from microfilm. Exchanges may be arranged of mutually important material. - L.R.
