- Ayer, A. J. Russell and Moore: the Analytical Heritage. London: Macmillan; Cambridge, Mass.: Harvard U. P., 1971. 264p. £3.90.
- Brandt, Heinz. The Search for a Third Way. Garden City, N. Y.: Doubleday, 1970. 353p. Trans. from original German ed., 1967. The East Germans' imprisonment of Brandt was Russell's reason for refusing to wear the Carl von Ossietzky medal, awarded him by the DDR. Brandt reports his subsequent visit to Russell.
- Clendenning, John, ed. The Letters of Josiah Royce. Chicago and London: University of Chicago, 1970. 702p. Contains three letters to Russell; his replies are presumed lost.
- Connell, Charles. World-Famous Rebels. London: Odhams, 1970. 256p. £1.25. One chapter is on Russell.
- Gilmer, Walker. Horace Liveright: Publisher of The Twenties. New York: David Lewis, 1970. 301p. US \$8.95. Several pages on the publication of Marriage and Morals.
- Gross, Barry R. Analytic Philosophy: An Historical Introduction. New York: Pegasus, 1970. 245p. US \$6.95. Chs. 3 and 4 are on Russell on Meaning and Reference and on Sense Data.
- Hampshire, Stuart. Modern Writers and Other Essays. London: Chatto and Windus, 1969. 205p. £1.75. Chs. 13 and 14 are Hampshire's long reviews of Russell's Autobiography, Vols. I-II, from the New York Review of Books.
- Harrod, Sir Roy. Sociology, Morals and Mystery. London: Macmillan, 1971. 121p. £2.50. Quotes from a discussion with BR about J. Nicod.
