70, Overstrand Mansions, Prince of Wales Road, Battersea, S.W. 27.4.19

Dear Madam

I am afraid I am a very disappointing person from your point of view. My diet is absolutely ordinary and quite casual – I hardly know myself what it is. [Matthew VII 26.] [sic] As near as I can remember, when I have all my meals at home an average day would be:

Breakfast 1 Poached Egg, 1 Rasher of Bacon 2 slices toast with marmalade

Lunch Small quantity of fish, rice pudding, bread.

Tea A little buttered toast and a slice of cake

Dinner Soup, meat (say 2 mutton chops), potatoes, sweets (tart, stewed fruit, or whatever it may happen to be).

But fairly often I dine out with friends, or have friends to dine with me, and then I have a better meal.

I suppose on an average I spend a quarter of an hour over lunch and dinner, and ten minutes over breakfast.

I eat eggs, a little butter, no milk.

I drink tea in great quantities, alcohol only when I dine with friends or have friends to dine, and coffee on the same occasions. I take no other drinks except water.

I do not believe in any special diet for myself. Whenever I have tried doing without meat, I have found my capacity for work diminished. But I have no views as to other people.

I am sorry to be so commonplace.
