The Bertrand Russell Society. McMaster welcomes to its campus the 17th Annual Meeting of the Bertrand Russell Society. Our chapter has had talks this year on "Education and the Emotions" (B. Mattai), "Russell's Unpublished Manuscripts as the Only Way to Understand His Philosophical Evolution" (F. Rodríguez-Consuegra) and "Bertrand Russell (1872-1970): by Acquaintance and by Description" (I. Grattan-Guinness, *in absentia*).

Displays for the Russell Society meeting. Sheila Turcon has prepared a full gallery of displays. There are four cabinets holding Russell's many medals, awards and his honorary degree from the Université d'Aix-Marseille. Three cabinets illustrate Russell as activist: campaigning in Wimbledon, exhorting Nobel scientists to oppose nuclear war, and exposing the Vietnam War. Russell as letter-writer is featured in one cabinet titled "Literary Friends and Enemies" and another on the wide range of his correspondents from John Lennon to Einstein. There is a cabinet on his brother, Frank. Russell the author is shown in a cabinet on the *Collected Papers*.

Forthcoming in *Russell*. Professors Bansraj Mattai and Bernard Linsky will have articles on education and the axiom of reducibility, respectively.
