A.J. Ayer on Russell: a secondary bibliography

Possibly partly because of the praise Russell bestowed on him, Ayer was widely regarded by the British media as the academic authority on Russell. Indeed, his viewpoint and style were unique. While others were prepared to undertake archival research, Aver relied on his close contact with Russell himself and his primary works. However, as his moderation of the panel discussion published in 1988 shows, he was quite willing to entertain others' views in Russell studies and change his mind if he saw fit.

This bibliography does not claim to be complete. There are probably more reviews of Russell's books, and almost certainly more letters to the editor on controversies concerning Russell. One source for the items below was the bibliography in Perception and Identity: Essays Presented to A.J. Aver with His Replies to Them (London: Macmillan, 1979). However, it lists a review of the first volume of Russell's Autobiography in Encounter, but no review of it appeared there. A volume in The Library of Living Philosophers was planned for Aver and may reveal more items.

Ayer was an original member of the Advisory Editorial Board of The Collected Papers of Bertrand Russell.
