## Recent acquisitions: manuscripts, typescripts & proofs

THIS LISTING IS the first general update since 1987. It contains all the items that have arrived since then as well as a few items never before recorded that were discovered during my preparation of the last correspondence listing. The 77 entries here bring the total to 505 acquired since the Archives' arrival in 1968. This total includes the 41 items described in the Dora Russell Papers. The listing is by time of composition or, failing that, of publication; books are listed by date of publication. Bracketed titles are supplied for documents that lack titles. Quoted passages in brackets are the first words of such documents. Bold references are to, and first publication details are from, Blackwell and Ruja's forthcoming *Bibliography* of Russell's writings, Vol. I: *Separate Publications*, and Vol. II: *Serial Publications*. I wish to thank the 18 institutions who have provided us with copies. The last accession listed is REC. ACQ. I, III.



The scripts also have the typed line at the top of the first page: "Not checked with 'as broadcast' script". Thus the scripts listed here must be the ones Russell read from for the broadcast recording. The recorded broadcasts were then typed out, and the transcripts (usually) checked with the reading scripts, i.e. those listed here, and the "Not" was lined out. (Ed.)
