REVISIONS TO THE COLLECTED PAPERS' CHRONOLOGIES

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ver the years since the first volume of the Collected Papers appeared I have been keeping track of errors and omissions discovered in the Chronologies. These notations have always been available to researchers at the Russell Archives in a binder holding copies of all the published Chronologies. I am prompted, at this stage, to make my discoveries available to a wider audience since my work on Russell's chronology is drawing to a close. All Chronologies published to date have been prepared by me, but in future this will no longer be the case.

The holdings of the Russell Archives are vast. In my work as Archives Cataloguer I have discovered material for new entries. In several cases an entry was based on circumstantial or inconclusive evidence; more definitive evidence has since been uncovered. My BRACERS dating of Russell's letters to Lady Ottoline Morrell has made the information in them more accessible. Also, new documents continue to arrive in the Archives every month, adding to our knowledge of Russell's doings.

The significance of the revised entries varies, but all make a contribution to a fuller picture of Russell's life. This is important at a time when two biographies are being written and his Selected Letters edited. The most glaring error to note is that the date of his first meeting with Wittgenstein is given incorrectly in Papers 12 although the date is correct in Papers 7. The majority of the new items expand his known number of speeches. No additions have been made to his writings; the

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one reference to a lost writing was discussed in its volume but left out of the Chronology. New entries begin with an "N"; modified entries, with an "M".

This update should not be regarded as an official change to the published volumes. The editors bear final responsibility for the contents of the volumes, and these emendations represent my own views.

Volume 1: Cambridge Essays

Mar. 1895

While walking in the Tiergarten in Berlin decides to write two series of books.

Volume 2: Philosophical Papers

c. 15-21 Apr. 1897

Change beginning of entry to read: At Seatoller (in a farmhouse) near Keswick.

Volume 9: Essays on Language, Mind and Matter

6-27 Aug. 1923

At Pinewood View, Frimley Green, Surrey, his father-in-law's cottage, as both his own houses are let.

Volume 12: Contemplation and Action

Note: some of the entries found in Papers 12 will appear in corrected form in Papers 4 (forthcoming); they are not listed here.

29 July-4 Aug. 1903 Visits G. Lowes Dickinson in Thames Ditton, Surrey, before going to London "to plunge

into the Free Trade question".

Change date that follows late Jan. from c. 24 Feb. to mid-Feb.

Add: En route home stops in Paris alone for a dinner with philosophers and mathematicians organized in his honour.

1906 N 8 July 19071

Speaks at public meeting at the Guildhall, Cambridge, organized by the NUWSS.
