This listing is the first general update since 1990 (see Russell, n.s. 10, no. 2). It contains all the items that arrived since then until the end of my archival employment in June 1992. The fifteen entries here bring the total to 520 entries of manuscript-related acquisitions since the Archives' arrival in 1968.

The listing is by time of composition or, failing that, of publication; books are listed by date of publication. Bracketed titles are supplied for documents that lack titles. Quoted passages in brackets are the first words of such documents. Bold references are to, and first publication details are from, Blackwell and Ruja's Bibliography of Bertrand Russell. I wish to thank the three institutions that provided McMaster with copies of original documents in their possession.

The last accession listed is REC. Acq. 1,163. "P." means photocopy; "ts.", typescript or typed, depending upon the context; and "l.", letter.
