

BRACERS (II): RUSSELL'S ADDRESSES

The addresses from which we know that Russell wrote letters now number 378.¹ This is the total returned by BRACERS, the Bertrand Russell Archives Catalogue Entry and Retrieval System. The addresses include twenty countries and a prison. It seems an extraordinary number of places to be while maintaining a writing life and must qualify Russell as the second great peripatetic philosopher. Yet there are large stretches of time combined with varying addresses during which Russell seems to have written no letters at all. An instance is his trip to Greece with Edith Finch, later his fourth wife, from 8 to 26 April 1952. Analysis of a chronological sort of the letters from him may reveal other significant gaps. Such is our faith in Russell the letter-writer that we believe further cataloguing, or new discoveries of letters, will reveal use of Greek addresses and even many others.

In the table, locations are followed by the code used in the BRACERS address field. We confine use of the field to Russell's letters. Some explanation of the codes is needed. For Great Britain, only codes for London addresses may begin with "L". With all other countries, the name of the country is given first. This is followed by the city and then possibly a hotel or street address. The names of Russell's hosts are in parentheses. Hotels do not usually form part of an address. They appear in the Topic

Text field in BRACERS. The names of houses and hotels that do not include the term "House" or "Hotel" or their synonyms are set in italics. Places that he was headed to or going from in the train or on board ship are not in the address codes but appear in the Topic Text field. The abbreviations for "train" and "ship" appear in the address field. We lack so far any letters written in the air (although there is one from the Goose Bay airport²).

The location and code data, which reside in a wordprocessing table, are easily re-sorted in code order and, of course, may be searched in the Russell Archives. For this reason we have not provided an index of hosts.

The house symbol \triangle indicates a location at which Russell took up residence. Other addresses are transient ones.

By means of the address data we can date undated but addressed letters from Russell, determine whom he may have been visiting, and trace his itinerary on lecture tours to find new reports of the lectures. Misdated letters are revealed by their addresses being "out of place" in chronological sort, if one examines the address field. Also revealed may be the use of stationery from a previous address or residence and used (perhaps because nothing else was available) at the next one. And Russell scholars at last have data on where his friends lived to explain the cryptic notes in his appointment diaries.
