The last update of correspondence acquisitions appeared in *Russell*, n.s. 12 (1992): 208–10. See the “25-Year Index” for citations of all previous updates.

Dear Mrs. Chance

I am sorry to have taken so long over your MS, but I have been very busy.

I agree wholeheartedly with your view that it is important to think truthfully, & I am glad you are trying to make people understand your point.
